# LOCAL EMPLOYEES: Provides with respect to employment applications with political subdivisions

## DIGEST

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits a political subdivision, when filling an employment position, from inquiring about a prospective employee's arrest record on the initial application form.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a political subdivision to consider the prospective employee's arrest records in making the political subdivision's final employment determination.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that employment positions for which a background check is required by law are excepted from proposed law.

(Amends heading of Chapter 29 of Title 42; Adds R.S. 42:1702)

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Local and Municipal Affairs to the engrossed bill

- 1. Changes <u>from</u> "pending indictments" <u>to</u> "pending felony criminal charges" for which a political subdivision may inquire about on an initial application form.
- 2. Deletes the exception allowing a political subdivision to consider the prospective employee's arrest records in making the political subdivision's final employment determination.
