1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, delete lines 2 and 3 in their entirety and insert the following:

3 "To enact Chapter 36 of Title 40 of the"

4 AMENDMENT NO. 2

5 On page 1, at the end of line 4 change "through 2911" to "and 2902"

6 AMENDMENT NO. 3

7 On page 1, delete lines 5 through 12 in their entirety and insert the following:

8 "relative to law enforcement; to provide for data collection by law
9 enforcement agencies; to provide for the creation of a task force; to provide
10 for membership, duties, and meetings of the task force; to provide specific
11 topics for the task force to study; to provide relative to law enforcement
12 policies regarding racial profiling;"

13 AMENDMENT NO. 4

14 On page 1, line 16, change "through 2911" to "and 2902,"

15 AMENDMENT NO. 5

16 Delete pages 2 through 25 in their entirety and insert the following:

17 §2902. Law Enforcement Data Task Force
18 A. The Louisiana Legislature hereby creates the Law Enforcement Data Task
19 Force to study the collection and analysis of data regarding peace officer interaction
20 with the public.
21 B.(1) The membership of the task force shall be as follows:
22 (a)(i) One member shall be appointed by the Louisiana Commission on Law
23 Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice.
24 (ii) This member shall not be a voting member.
25 (iii) This member shall serve as the task force president.
26 (b) One member shall be appointed by the Louisiana Association of Chiefs
27 of Police.
28 (c) One member shall be appointed by the Louisiana Sheriffs' Association.
29 (d) One member shall be appointed by the Department of Public Safety and
30 Corrections, office of state police.
31 (e) One member shall be appointed by Pelican Institute for Public Policy.
32 (f) One member shall be appointed by Southern Poverty Law Center.
33 (g) One member shall be appointed by Public Affairs Research Council.
34 (h) One member shall be appointed by American Civil Liberties Union of
35 Louisiana.
36 (i) One member shall be appointed by the Louisiana American Federation
37 of Labor-Congress of Industrial Organizations (AFL-CIO).
38 (j) One member shall be appointed by the Louisiana Supreme Court.
39 (k) One member shall be appointed by Louisiana Survivors for Reform.

1 (l) One member shall be appointed by the Louisiana District Attorneys
 2 Association.

3 (m) One member shall be appointed by the Louisiana Judicial Council.

4 (n) One member shall be appointed by the Council on Peace Officer
 5 Standards and Training.

6 C. The task force meetings shall be subject to the Open Meetings Law.

7 D. The task force shall not create any subcommittees, but shall handle all
 8 matters before the task force.

9 E. The task force shall meet at least quarterly for one year, and the initial
 10 meeting shall be no later than November 30, 2019. Dates and times for all remaining
 11 task force meetings shall be agreed upon by all appointed members of the task force.

12 F. The task force shall discuss and report on the following topics with
 13 respect to the collection of data and information by law enforcement agencies:

14 (1) Current methods of data collection in the state of Louisiana.

15 (2) Current methods of data collection outside the state of Louisiana.

16 (3) Current methods of reporting data outside the state of Louisiana.

17 (4) Methods of utilizing data collection and reporting to improve public
 18 safety, community engagement, and public confidence in law enforcement.

19 (5) The manner in which rural and small law enforcement agencies currently
 20 comply with data collection requirements in other states.

21 (6) Recommendations on the expansion of data collection and reporting.

22 (7) Possible methods of transmitting collected data by law enforcement
 23 agencies for aggregated presentation.

24 (8) A cost analysis for the collection of extensive data, including but not
 25 limited to the following:

26 (a) Traffic stops.

27 (b) Pedestrian stops.

28 (c) Clearance rates.

29 (d) Execution of no-knock warrants.

30 (e) Use of special weapons and tactics teams.

31 (f) Use of force.

32 (9) Current policies against racial profiling utilized by individual law
 33 enforcement agencies in the state. The task force shall review the policies of each
 34 law enforcement agency to determine whether the agency is excepted from the
 35 reporting requirements as provided in R.S. 32:398.10(E).

36 G. The task force shall accept written or in-person testimony regarding all
 37 matters it considers and shall include all relevant public testimony in its final report
 38 required by Subsection H of this Section.

39 H. The task force shall submit a written report to the Louisiana Commission
 40 on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice, the House Committee
 41 on Judiciary, the Senate Committee on Judiciary B, and the Council on Peace
 42 Officers Standards and Training by January thirty-first of each calendar year. The
 43 initial report shall be submitted by the task force on January 31, 2021."
