18	from the Louisiana National Guard's Youth ChalleNGe Program to continue their
19	education and enhance their skills by providing for tuition at an eligible Louisiana
20	postsecondary institution to further their skills and occupational training in a
21	technical program.
22	§3050.2. Tuition grants; eligibility; continuation; limits
23	A.(1) As part of the Grant Opportunity for Youth ChalleNGe Skills Training
24	Program, hereinafter referred to as the "GO-Youth ChalleNGe Program", the state
25	shall award a grant in an amount determined by the administering agency to equal
26	the actual cost of tuition of any student who enrolls on a full-time basis in a
27	Louisiana public postsecondary institution to pursue skill or occupational training,
28	including a vocational technical education certificate or diploma or a nonacademic
29	undergraduate degree a certificate, diploma, or associate or baccalaureate
30	<u>undergraduate degree required for a high-demand, high-skill, high-wage career</u> .
31	(2) The state shall award a grant in an amount determined by the administering
32	agency to be equal to the average grant amount paid under this Section for students
33	attending a public postsecondary institution to any student who enrolls on a full-time
34	basis at a regionally accredited independent college or university in the state that is
35	a member of the Louisiana Association of Independent Colleges or Universities to
36	pursue skill or occupational training, including, a vocational technical education
37	certificate or diploma or a nonacademic undergraduate degree a certificate,
38	diploma, or associate or baccalaureate undergraduate degree required for a
39	<u>high-demand, high-skill, high-wage career.</u>
40	(3) To be eligible for a grant as provided for in this Section, a student must meet all
41	of the following qualifications and all other applicable qualifications of this Chapter:
42	(a) Is a resident of Louisiana, as defined by the administering agency, during the
43	twenty-four months preceding enrollment in a technical program at an eligible
