5	WHEREAS, it is with deep regret and profound sorrow that the citizens of Louisiana
6	learned of the death of James Donald "Don" Lincoln on May 7, 2019, at the age of
7	sixty-five; and
8	WHEREAS, James Donald "Don" Lincoln merits posthumous commendation for his
9	significant and voluminous contributions to Louisiana cinema, culture, and the arts as an
10	actor who worked on more than three dozen major motion pictures, mini-series, television
11	shows, and music videos, including Seabiscuit, Glory Road, Welcome to the Rileys, Failure
12	to Launch, and Elvis; and
13	WHEREAS, he portrayed the main character in the music video "Counting Stars" by
14	OneRepublic, which has been viewed across the world more than 2.7 billion times; and
15	WHEREAS, Don Lincoln was born on October 10, 1953, in Shreveport, Louisiana,
16	to James Alvin Lincoln and Nancy Jane George, was reared in California, and was educated
17	at Pepperdine University in Malibu, during which time he played second base on the
18	baseball team and became a lifelong fan of the Los Angeles Angels; and

1	WHEREAS, Susan Roed "Sue" Lincoln was the love of his life and they were
2	married on May 26, 1978, and raised their three remarkable children, Kirsten Samantha,
3	Nicholas James, and Alyssa Ruth; and
4	WHEREAS, Don and Sue's lives were further enriched by three grandchildren and
5	their shared love of literature, nature, music, and adventure; and
6	WHEREAS, Don excelled in his career, despite battling a lifelong stutter, by
7	cultivating and practicing compassion, empathy, and genuine concern for all those he
8	encountered; and
9	WHEREAS, he demonstrated a deep and infectious passion for serving those most
10	in need, and
11	WHEREAS, Don cared for men and women suffering from HIV as a board member
12	of the Southwest Louisiana AIDS Association, and also educated children alongside law
13	enforcement officers as a member of the Louisiana Renegades; and
14	WHEREAS, he cherished the land and the people of Louisiana with charm, humor,
15	and joy; was a gentleman who was admired by all whose lives he touched; Don leaves
16	behind a rich and unique legacy and is greatly missed; and
17	WHEREAS, with the death of James Donald "Don" Lincoln, Louisiana has lost one
18	of its finest sons, a quintessential southern gentleman who loved his community and whose
19	accomplishments have left an indelible mark upon his community, state, and nation.
20	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
21	express sincere and heartfelt condolences upon the death of James Donald "Don" Lincoln,
22	posthumously commend him for his outstanding contributions to Louisiana cinema, culture,
23	and the arts, and extend enduring appreciation for the tremendous pride and honor he will
24	forever bring to the Baton Rouge community, the state of Louisiana, and the United States
25	of America.
