We, the conferees appointed to confer over the disagreement between the two houses concerning House Bill No. 127 by Representative Pierre, recommend the following concerning the Engrossed bill:

- 1. That Senate Floor Amendments Nos. 1 through 4 by Senator Cortez (#2329) be adopted.
- 2. That the following amendments be adopted:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

In Senate Floor Amendment No. 5 by Senator Cortez (#2329), on page 1, line 17, change "(f) Urban-local minor collector." to "(f) Urban-local minor collector."

AMENDMENT NO. 2

In Senate Floor Amendment No. 5 by Senator Cortez (#2329), on page 1, line 18, change "(g) Urban-local." to "(g) Urban-local."

AMENDMENT NO. 3

In Senate Floor Amendment No. 5 by Senator Cortez (#2329), on page 1, line 22, change "(c) <u>Rural-minor principal</u> arterial-other." to "(c) Rural-minor <u>principal</u> arterial-other."

TRANSPORTATION DEPT: Updates the classifications within the state highway system

Report adopts Senate amendments to:

- 1. Provide for technical changes.
- 2. Amend provisions of law to update classifications within the state highway system to correspond with classifications of highways as provided in federal law.

Report amends the bill to:

1. Provide for technical changes.

Digest of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

<u>Present law</u> provides that the system of state highways must consist of 12 functional classifications divided into two categories: Urban and Rural. The Urban classifications are described as: urban-principal arterial-interstate, urban-principal arterial-other freeways and expressways, urban-principal arterial-other, urban-minor arterial, urban-collector, and urban-local. The Rural classifications are described as: rural-principal arterial-interstate, rural-principal arterial-other, rural-minor arterial, rural-major collector, rural-minor collector, and rural-local.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the amount of classifications <u>from</u> 12 <u>to</u> 14 by adding urban-minor collector to the urban classification and rural-principal arterial-other freeways and expressways to the rural classification.

<u>Proposed law</u> reclassifies urban-collector to urban-major collector.
