## **ACT 14 (HB 305)**

<u>Existing law</u> (R.S. 51:1405) prohibits unfair and deceptive acts or practices in the conduct of any trade or commerce.

<u>Existing law</u> (R.S. 51:1409) creates a private right of action to recover damages sustained pursuant to unfair or deceptive acts or practices.

Existing law (R.S. 51:1402) defines "elder person" as any person sixty-five years of age or older. Existing law also defines "person with a disability" as a person with a mental, physical, or developmental disability that substantially impairs that person's ability to provide adequately for his own care or protection.

New law retains existing law.

<u>New law</u> defines "telephone" to include cellular phones and further provides definitions for electronic mail and text messaging.

<u>New law</u> provides for an increased potential for damages when the prohibited unfair or deceptive act was knowingly committed against an elder person or person with a disability using a telephone, electronic mail, or text messaging.

<u>New law</u> provides that no telephone, electronic mail, internet, cable, or other telecommunications service provider shall be liable for any violation of <u>new law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2019.
