Abstract: Eliminates the mandatory retirement age for judges, implements a three-term limitation, and extends the term of office from six to 10 years.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that a judge shall not remain in office beyond his 70th birthday. A judge who attains 70 years of age while serving a term of office shall be allowed to complete that term of office.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> eliminates the mandatory retirement age for judges.

Present constitution provides that the term of a district, parish, or city court judge shall be six years.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> changes the term of office for district, parish, and city court judge <u>from</u> six years <u>to</u> 10 years.

Present constitution provides that judges shall be elected at the regular congressional election.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> retains <u>present constitution</u> and establishes a three term limitation.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 3, 2020.
