TEACHERS: Provides relative to the training requirements of certain mandatory reporters of child abuse and neglect

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact Children's Code Article 603.1, relative to mandatory reporters of 3 child abuse and neglect; to provide relative to the training requirements for certain 4 mandatory reporters; to require teachers and child care providers to complete an 5 annual training on mandatory reporter laws; to provide for the retention of records 6 of completion; and to provide for related matters. 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 8 Section 1. Children's Code Article 603.1 is hereby amended and reenacted to read 9 as follows: 10 Art. 603.1. Required education; reporting child abuse 11 A. Commencing May 1, 2006, every person graduating from any teacher 12 preparation program in Louisiana shall have had in his curriculum instruction on the 13 requirements of and how to report suspected child abuse cases pursuant to Children's 14 Code Article 601 et seq., as well as instruction on how to identify the signs and 15 symptoms of child neglect and abuse, including sexual abuse, in order to receive his 16 teacher certification. 17 B. Beginning August 1, 2020, within the first two weeks after the first day of each new school year, teaching and child care providers as defined by Article 603 18 19 of this Code are required to complete an online training course provided by the 20 Department of Children and Family Services. A record of completion of the course

Abstract: Requires annual training on mandatory reporting requirements for teachers and child care providers.

<u>Present law</u> requires certain persons, defined as mandatory reporters, to report to the Dept. of Children and Family Services or to law enforcement when the person has cause to believe that a child's physical or mental health is endangered as a result of abuse or neglect.

<u>Present law</u> provides for a list of persons who are defined as mandatory reporters including "teachers and child care providers".

<u>Present law</u> requires the Dept. of Children and Family Services to provide training on the statutory requirements and responsibility of reporting child abuse and neglect including the consequences of the failure to report.

<u>Present law</u> requires every person graduating from any teacher preparation program in La. to have had in his curriculum instruction on the requirements of and how to report suspected child abuse cases pursuant to <u>present law</u>, as well as instruction on how to identify the signs and symptoms of child neglect and abuse, including sexual abuse, in order to receive his teacher certification.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that beginning Aug. 1, 2020, within the first two weeks after the first day of each new school year, teaching and child care providers as defined by <u>present law</u> are required to complete an online training course provided by the Dept. of Children and Family Services. <u>Proposed law</u> further requires a record of completion of the course by the teacher or child care provider to be provided to and retained by each entity at which the teacher or child care provider is employed, and requires the entity to retain a list of those teachers or child care providers who have not complied with the <u>proposed law</u> training requirements.
