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Repeals certain reporting and notice requirements applicable to certain licensing boards and commissions

Proposes to repeal R.S. 37:23.2, relative to licensing boards and commissions, removing the requirement that boards/commissions submit quarterly reports to the appropriate legislative oversight committees and to the House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs and the Senate Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs. Reports include the number of complaints received regarding board actions and procedures and a summary of each complaint and the disposition of each complaint. The proposed law also repeals the requirement that boards/commission give notice to applicants/licensees that they may submit complaints about the boards to the appropriate legislative oversight committee.
