

1 WHEREAS, Chief Justice Johnson's judicial career began in 1984, after she became
2 the first woman elected to the Civil District Court of New Orleans; in 1990, she was
3 reelected to her office after running unopposed, and in 1994, her colleagues elected her to
4 the position of chief judge; also in 1994, she was first elected to the Louisiana Supreme
5 Court and was reelected without opposition in 2000 and 2010; she was sworn in as chief
6 justice in 2013; and

7 WHEREAS, as a civil trial judge, Bernette Johnson was first assigned to the
8 Domestic Relations Court, where she established a system to refer custody, alimony, and
9 child support issues to mediation conducted by certified social workers of the Children's
10 Bureau and Family Services prior to court appearances; and

11 WHEREAS, as a supreme court justice, Chief Justice Johnson served on the
12 Louisiana Supreme Court's Judicial Council, the Louisiana Supreme Court's Legal Services
13 Task Force, and the National Campaign on Best Practices in the area of Racial and Ethnic
14 Fairness in the Courts; she has worked closely with the Louisiana Supreme Court's
15 Mandatory Continuing Legal Education Committee and the Committee on Bar Admissions,
16 and she was the Supreme Court's appointee to the Louisiana State Law Institute; and

17 WHEREAS, Chief Justice Johnson has received countless awards including the
18 prestigious Joan Dempsey Klein Award from the National Association of Women Judges
19 and the Spirit of Excellence Award from the American Bar Association's Commission on
20 Racial and Ethnic Diversity in the Profession, and she was inducted into the National Bar
21 Association's Hall of Fame and received the association's Distinguished Civil Rights
22 Advocate Award; and

23 WHEREAS, Madame Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson has worked as an
24 advocate for social justice, civil rights, and community organizing throughout her career, and
25 her truly incredible career is most deserving of the highest praise and recognition.

26 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
27 commend Madame Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson on her retirement from the
28 Louisiana Supreme Court; does hereby express genuine appreciation for her tireless pursuit
29 of social justice and equality; does hereby recognize her illustrious career and numerous

1 accomplishments; and does hereby extend sincere hopes and wishes for her continued good
2 health and prosperity as she enters into her retirement.

3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to
4 Madame Chief Justice Bernette Joshua Johnson and the Louisiana Supreme Court.
