 A. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the following

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 meanings:
- 13(1) "Applicant" means an applicant, key participant, and designated14responsible party.
- (2) "FBI" means the Federal Bureau of Investigation of the United States
 Department of Justice.
- 17B. In addition to any other requirements established by department rules, the18department shall require an applicant, as a condition of eligibility to licensure, to do19the following:
- 20 (1) Submit a full set of fingerprints, in a form and manner prescribed by the
 21 department.
- (2) Permit the department to request and obtain state and national criminal
 history record information on the applicant.
- 24 (3) Pay the reasonable costs to be incurred by the applicant in requesting and
 25 obtaining state and national criminal history record information on the applicant to
 26 be directed to the department.
- C. In accordance with the provisions and procedure prescribed by this Part,
 the department shall request and obtain state and national criminal history record
 information from the bureau and the FBI relative to any applicant for licensure
 whose fingerprints the department has obtained pursuant to this Part for the purpose
 of determining the applicant's eligibility for licensure.
- 32 D. Upon request by the department and upon submission of an applicant's
 33 fingerprints, and such other identifying information as may be required, the bureau
 34 shall survey its criminal history records and identification files and make a
 35 simultaneous request of the FBI for like information from other jurisdictions. The

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bureau may charge the applicant a reasonable processing fee for conducting and
 reporting on any such search.

3 E. Any and all state or national criminal history record information obtained 4 by the department from the bureau or FBI which is not already a matter of public 5 record shall be deemed nonpublic and confidential information restricted to the 6 exclusive use by the department in evaluating the applicant's eligibility or 7 disqualification for licensure. No such information or records related thereto shall, except with the written consent of the applicant or by order of a court of competent 8 9 jurisdiction, be released or otherwise disclosed by the department to any other person 10 or agency."
