DENTISTRY: Provides relative to waiver of certain dental licensing requirements during a declared state of emergency

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> provides that a requirement for an applicant who has successfully completed any national, regional, or independent third-party clinical dental licensing examination approved by the board shall include procedures performed on human subjects.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that in accordance with Proclamation Number 58-JBE-2020, the use of human subjects to test an applicant's clinical competency may be waived or modified.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a requirement for an applicant who has successfully completed any national, regional, or independent third-party clinical dental hygiene licensing examination approved by the board shall include procedures performed on human subjects.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that in accordance with Proclamation Number 58-JBE-2020, the use of human subjects to test an applicant's clinical competency may be waived or modified.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
