## HOUSE SUMMARY OF SENATE AMENDMENTS

## HB 530 2020 Regular Session Echols

INSURANCE/HEALTH: Provides for coverage of healthcare services provided through telehealth or telemedicine

## **Synopsis of Senate Amendments**

- 1. Remove the definition of "store-and-forward telemedicine services" and all related provisions.
- 2. Clarify that telehealth and telemedicine include audio-only conversations as authorized by <u>present law</u> (R.S. 40:1223.3 and R.S. 37:1271).
- 3. Remove <u>proposed law</u> provisions requiring health insurance coverage of services provided through telehealth or telemedicine.
- 4. Authorize a health coverage plan issuer to post a link on its website to comply with the <u>proposed law</u> requirement to conspicuously display information on covered telehealth, telemedicine, or remote patient monitoring services.
- 5. Modify relative to remote patient monitoring services by changing the location of patient services <u>from</u> home or residential settings <u>to</u> home or other nontraditional clinical settings.
- 6. Make technical changes.

## Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "health coverage plan", "medication adherence management services", "platform", "remote patient monitoring services", "telehealth", and "telemedicine".

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the issuer of a health coverage plan to display in a conspicuous manner on the issuer's internet website patient information regarding how the patient may receive covered telehealth, telemedicine, or and remote patient monitoring services. Further provides that a link clearly identified on the health coverage plan's issuer's website to the required information is sufficient to comply with <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires remote patient monitoring services through telehealth or telemedicine to consist of an assessment, problem identification, evaluation, and the implementation of a management plan. Further requires the entity providing remote patient monitoring services to have certain enumerated protocols in place.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a health coverage plan may require an authorization request for remote patient monitoring prior to the health coverage plan's approval of coverage for a specified health care service.

<u>Proposed law</u> does not apply to any plan providing coverage for excepted benefits, limited benefit health insurance plans, and short-term policies with a term of less than 12 months.

Effective Jan. 1, 2021.
