HOLIDAYS: Requests the governor and the legislature to take such actions as are necessary to observe Juneteenth as a state holiday

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the governor and the legislature of Louisiana to take such actions as are
3	necessary to recognize the historical significance of Juneteenth Day and to observe
4	Juneteenth as a state holiday.
5	WHEREAS, news of the end of slavery did not reach frontier areas of the United
6	States, and in particular the southwestern states, for more than two and a half years after
7	President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, which was issued on January 1, 1863, and
8	months after the conclusion of the Civil War; and
9	WHEREAS, Juneteenth is an annual observance and celebration of the date Union
10	soldiers enforced the Emancipation Proclamation freeing all remaining slaves in Galveston,
11	Texas, on June 19, 1865; and
12	WHEREAS, since 1865, the day has been celebrated as the day African-Americans
13	received the news of the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation; and
14	WHEREAS, Juneteenth commemorates the strength and resolve of
15	African-Americans throughout our history, and is an opportunity to highlight the value of
16	African-American culture, art, history, and achievement; and
17	WHEREAS, the celebration of the end of slavery is an important and enriching part
18	of the history and heritage of the United States; and

1 WHEREAS, for more than one hundred fifty years, Juneteenth Day celebrations have 2 been held to honor African-American freedom while encouraging self-development and 3 respect for all cultures; and 4 WHEREAS, forty-six states and the District of Columbia have designated Juneteenth 5 Day as a special day of observance in recognition of the emancipation of all slaves in the 6 United States; and 7 WHEREAS, in 1997, the 105th United States Congress officially recognized 8 Juneteenth as the observance of Independence Day of Americans of African descent; and 9 WHEREAS, Juneteenth reflects our belief in liberty and equality for every citizen, as everyone can benefit from a greater understanding and appreciation of the experiences of 10 11 others. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 12 13 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the governor and the legislature of 14 Louisiana to take such actions as are necessary to recognize the historical significance of 15 Juneteenth Day and to observe Juneteenth as a state holiday.
