ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

EG NO IMPACT GF RV See Note

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Authorizes eligibility for certain industries to participate in the Louisiana Quality Jobs Program. (Item #18) (7/1/20)

Present law allows ten years of payroll subsidy to qualifying firms of 4% or 6% of participating payroll depending on hourly wage, as well as a choice of a sales tax rebate on qualifying expenditures or a refundable credit of 1.5% of qualifying capital expenditures. Firms are required to offer a healthcare benefit that meets federally mandated requirements. Applications for the program shall be filed within 24 months of the filing of the advance notification.

Proposed law allows businesses to request a 30-day extension of time in which to file its application, so long as such request is received by LED no later than the application filing deadline.

Effective July 1, 2020.
