WHEREAS, Roby Bearden Jr. was devoted to Baton Rouge Green, an organization formed in 1987 to help restore the urban canopy of Baton Rouge, and which over the past thirty years has been ever-present in the capital region, maintaining thousands of trees along major roadways and interstates, planting trees with school children, helping underserved neighborhoods with community greening, and cultivating urban orchards to provide citrus to all citizens; and

WHEREAS, he was an avid gardener and fisherman, loved the beach, and was devoted to his family, friends, and career; and
