11	D. Notwithstanding any other provision of this rule to the contrary, if the
12	legislature is not in session, and in response to a gubernatorially declared
13	disaster or emergency, legislative approval of adjustments adopted by the State
14	Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to the most recently approved
15	minimum foundation program formula shall be by ballot.

<u>Present joint rule</u> provides for legislative approval of the minimum foundation program formula (MFP) annually adopted by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education by means of adoption of a concurrent resolution. Further provides that the concurrent resolution to effectuate legislative approval of the MFP formula shall only be adopted by the same vote and according to the same procedures required for the enactment of a bill.

<u>Proposed joint rule</u> retains these provisions and additionally provides that if the legislature is not in session, and in response to a gubernatorially declared disaster or emergency, legislative approval of adjustments adopted by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to the most recently approved minimum foundation program formula shall be by ballot.
