2 To adopt House Rule 3.6 of the Rules of Order of the House of Representatives to prohibit reprimands or reprisals against employees of the House of Representatives under 3 4 certain circumstances. 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana 6 that House Rule 3.6 of the Rules of Order of the House of Representatives is hereby adopted to read as follows: 7 8 Rule 3.6. House employees; reprisal prohibition 9 During a public health emergency that involves a pathogen transmitted 10 through respirable droplets, no employee of the House of Representatives shall be 11 subject to reprimand or reprisal for requesting that any person, including a legislator, 12 wear a mask covering the mouth and nose of the person during any encounter related 13 to employee's employment with the House of Representatives in which the person 14 is within six feet of the employee.

Abstract: During specified public health emergencies, prohibits reprisals against any employee of the House for asking a person to wear a mask during any employment situation in which the person is within six feet of the employee.

<u>Proposed House Rule</u> prohibits, during a public health emergency that involves a pathogen transmitted through respirable droplets, any employee of the House of Representatives from being subject to reprimand or reprisal for requesting that any person, including a legislator, wear a mask covering the mouth and nose of the person during any encounter related to the employee's employment with the House of Representatives in which the person is within six feet of the employee.
