Talbot

<u>Present law</u> provides for the issuance of permits by the La. Department of Health for retail food establishments.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides that any applicant who timely paid the applicable permit fees and obtained a permit that was effective on March 17, 2020, shall be eligible for one of the following:

- (1) A reduction in the amount of the next regularly scheduled permit renewal fee if the applicant's business establishment was required to temporarily cease retail operations pursuant to Proclamation Number 30 JBE 2020, or any subsequent proclamation declaring the existence of a statewide COVID-19 public health emergency. The amount of the reduction is based on the number of days during calendar year 2020 that the business establishment was required to temporarily cease operations.
- (2) A refund of the fee paid for the permit that was in effect if a permitted business establishment has permanently closed as a result of the mandate to temporarily cease retail operations pursuant to Proclamation Number 30 JBE 2020, or any subsequent proclamation declaring the existence of a statewide COVID-19 public health emergency, on a pro rata basis for the number of days during calendar year 2020 that the permit holder was required to temporarily cease operations.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary B to the original bill

1. Removes all provisions referencing the office of alcohol and tobacco control.

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs to the engrossed bill

1. Changes the exemption from the permit fee to a reduction in the amount of the fee based on the number of days during calendar year 2020 that the permit holder was required to temporarily cease operations.

- 2. Specifies that refunds for permanently closed businesses are made on a pro rata basis for the number of days during calendar year 2020 that the permit holder was required to temporarily cease operations.
- 3. Makes technical corrections.
