## A RESOLUTION

To express the condolences of the House of Representatives upon the death of Geoffrey Hingle.

WHEREAS, Geoffrey Choate Hingle was born on September 2, 1956, in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, to Elmira Avery Hingle and Alvin Joseph Hingle; his father was a Purple Heart combat veteran of World War II and a native of Plaquemines Parish; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hingle was a 1974 graduate of Broadmoor High School in Baton Rouge, and he attended Louisiana State University, where he was a proud member of the Sigma Chi Fraternity; he also served as an assistant weight training coach for LSU athletics; he never passed up an opportunity to cheer on the LSU Tigers and even earned a spot on the school's cheerleading squad; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hingle completed his bachelor's degree in electrical engineering at Southern University and, afterwards, worked with General Dynamics/Lockheed Martin; while working, he also earned two master's degrees and completed his Ph.D. at Southern Methodist University; his incredible work ethic and intelligence quickly earned him the title of chief of systems engineering over weapons systems and avionics for General Dynamics/Lockheed Martin's F-16 and F-22 fighter jet programs; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hingle returned to Louisiana with his family in 1997, and he began a successful entrepreneurial career; he founded PMOLink, LLC, an engineering and consulting firm, and created dozens of jobs across southeast Louisiana; he also trained and educated thousands of professionals in project management, process management, and project scheduling and controls; and
