ELECTION OFFENSES. Provides relative to acts prohibited during early voting or on election day. (gov sig)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 18:1462(A)(2), (3), (4), and (5), relative to acts prohibited during
3	early voting or on election day; to provide relative to lawful activities; to provide for
4	campaign material and political advertising restrictions; and to provide for related
5	matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 18:1462 (A)(2), (3), (4), and (5) are hereby amended and reenacted
8	to read as follows:
9	§1462. Acts prohibited during early voting or on election day; electioneering;
10	intimidation; exceptions; enforcement; penalties
11	A. The Legislature of Louisiana recognizes that the right to vote is a right that
12	is essential to the effective operation of a democratic government. Due to a past,
13	longstanding history of election problems, such as multiple voting, votes being
14	recorded for persons who did not vote, votes being recorded for deceased persons,
15	voting by non-residents, vote buying, and voter intimidation, the legislature finds
16	that the state has a compelling interest in securing a person's right to vote in an
17	environment which is free from intimidation, harassment, confusion, obstruction, and

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1	undue influence. The legislature, therefore, enacts this Subsection to provide for a
2	six hundred foot campaign-free zone around polling places to provide to each voter
3	such an environment in which to exercise his right to vote. Except as otherwise
4	specifically provided by law, it shall be unlawful for any person, between the hours
5	of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m., to perform or cause to be performed any of the following
6	acts within any polling place being used in an election on election day or during
7	early voting, or within a radius of six hundred feet of the entrance to any polling
8	place being used in an election on election day or during early voting:
9	* * *

(2) To remain within any such polling place or within a radius of six hundred
feet of the entrance of any such polling place, except when exercising the right to
vote or engaging in any other lawful activity, after having been directed by an
election commissioner, law enforcement officer, registrar, or deputy registrar to
leave the premises or area of a polling place.

(3) To hand out, place, or display campaign cards, pictures, or other
 campaign literature of any kind or description whatsoever <u>which advocates for or</u>
 <u>against any candidate, proposition, or political party appearing on the ballot in</u>
 the election.

(4) To place or display political signs, pictures, or other forms of political
 advertising which advocate for or against any candidate, proposition, or political
 party appearing on the ballot in the election.

22 (5) To circulate a recall petition or seek handwritten signatures to a recall
23 petition.

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25 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 26 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 27 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 28 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 29 effective on the day following such approval.

Except as otherwise specifically provided by law, <u>present law</u> provides for a campaign-free zone around polling places by prohibiting certain acts between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. within any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting, or within a radius of 600 feet of the entrance to any polling place being used in an election on election day or during early voting.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits soliciting any other person to vote for or against any candidate or proposition being voted on in an election within the zone during the designated time period.

Proposed law retains present law.

Except when exercising the right to vote, <u>present law</u> prohibits remaining within the zone during the designated time period after having been directed by an election commissioner, law enforcement officer, registrar, or deputy registrar to leave.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows a person to remain within the zone during the designated time period when exercising any lawful activity.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits handing out, placing, or displaying campaign cards, pictures, or other campaign literature of any kind or description whatsoever and placing or displaying political signs, pictures, or other forms of political advertising within the zone during the designated time period.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the prohibition applies to materials advocating for or against any candidate, proposition, or political party appearing on the ballot in the election.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits circulating a recall petition or seeking handwritten signatures to a recall petition within the zone during the designated time period.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further prohibits circulating or seeking signatures to any petition within the zone during the designated time period.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
