SCHOOLS: Authorizes public school governing authorities to establish learning pods for the purpose of providing small group instruction for students enrolled in public schools

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 17:3996(B)(59) and Chapter 43-B of Title 17 of the Louisiana Revised
3	Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 17:4036.1, relative to elementary and
4	secondary education; to authorize public school governing authorities to establish
5	student learning pods for the purpose of providing small group instruction; to provide
6	that students assigned to learning pods shall be enrolled in the school; to require
7	instruction in learning pods to be provided by public school teachers; to provide
8	relative to funding; to provide relative to policies and procedures; to provide for an
9	effective date; and to provide for related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 17:3996(B)(59) and Chapter 43-B of Title 17 of the Louisiana
12	Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 17:4036.1, are hereby enacted to read as
13	follows:
14	CHAPTER 43-B. LEARNING PODS
15	§4036.1. Learning pods
16	A. Each public school governing authority may establish learning pods as
17	an extension of any school under its jurisdiction. For purposes of this Section,
18	"learning pod" means a group of at least ten students enrolled in the school who
19	receive instruction in a small group setting.

1	B. A student shall only be assigned to a learning pod if the assignment is
2	requested by his parent or authorized by his parent upon the recommendation of
3	school officials.
4	C. All instruction provided to students assigned to learning pods shall be
5	provided by teachers on the staff of the school who meet all qualifications and are
6	subject to all requirements applicable to teachers at the school who are not assigned
7	to a learning pod.
8	D. Students assigned to a learning pod shall be:
9	(1) Counted among the enrollment of the public school governing authority
10	for purposes of full funding through the Minimum Foundation Program formula.
11	(2) Subject to all requirements applicable to students enrolled in the school
12	who are not assigned to a learning pod.
13	(3) Eligible for participation in all services and activities for which they
14	would be eligible if not assigned to a learning pod.
15	E. The establishment of learning pods shall be subject to policies and
16	procedures adopted by a public school governing authority, which, at a minimum,
17	shall provide for the following:
18	(1) The student population of the learning pod, which may be a blended
19	population of students of different grade levels.
20	(2) The method of instruction for the learning pod, which may occur in-
21	person at a physical location on the school campus, remotely through virtual
22	instruction, or through a hybrid approach that combines both methods.
23	(3) Any specialized curriculum or program provided in the learning pod.
24	(4) The process for a parent to request student assignment to a learning pod,
25	grant authorization for a student's assignment to a learning pod if recommended by
26	school officials, and withdraw a student from a learning pod.

28	§3996. Charter schools; exemptions; requirements

1 B. Notwithstanding any state law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and 2 except as may be otherwise specifically provided for in an approved charter, a charter school established and operated in accordance with the provisions of this 3 4 Chapter and its approved charter and the school's officers and employees shall be exempt from all statutory mandates or other statutory requirements that are 5 6 applicable to public schools and to public school officers and employees except for 7 the following laws otherwise applicable to public schools with the same grades: 8 9 (59) Learning pods (R.S. 17:4036.1). 10 11 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 12 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 13 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 14 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 15 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Authorizes the establishment of learning pods as extensions of public schools for the purpose of small group instruction.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes each public school governing authority to establish learning pods as an extension of any school under its jurisdiction. Defines "learning pod" as a group of at least 10 students enrolled in the school who receive instruction in a small group setting and further provides:

- (1) All instruction provided to students assigned to learning pods shall be provided by teachers on the school's staff.
- (2) Students shall only be assigned to a learning pod upon parental request or authorization upon recommendation of school officials and shall be:
 - (a) Counted among the enrollment of the public school governing authority for purposes of full funding through the Minimum Foundation Program formula.
 - (b) Subject to all requirements applicable to students enrolled in the school who are not assigned to learning pods.

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- (c) Eligible for participation in all services and activities for which they would be eligible if not assigned to a learning pod.
- (3) Provides for local policies and procedures, which, at minimum, shall provide for:
 - (a) The student population of the learning pod, which may be a blended population of students of different grade levels.
 - (b) The method of instruction for the learning pod, which may occur in-person at a physical location on the school campus, remotely through virtual instruction, or through a hybrid approach that combines both methods.
 - (c) Any specialized curriculum or program provided in the learning pod.
 - (d) The process for parents to request a student's assignment to a learning pod, grant authorization for a student's assignment to a learning pod if recommended by school officials, and withdraw a student from a learning pod.

Proposed law is applicable to all public schools, including charter schools.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
