WHEREAS, he was a member of the Delta Kappa Epsilon "Dekes" Alumni Association, where he continued to advance that fraternity's tradition of "producing outstanding gentlemen, leaders, and jolly good fellows"; and

WHEREAS, he was an active member of the Marine Corps League, contributing to that organization's mission of promoting the interests and preserving the traditions of the United States Marine Corps, strengthening the fraternity of Marines and their families, serving all those who wear or have worn the Eagle, Globe, and Anchor, and fostering the ideals of Americanism and patriotic volunteerism; and

WHEREAS, Tom is remembered as a lovely person and good friend, with a quick wit and generous smile, who was devoted to his family and loved them selflessly; and

WHEREAS, he was an extraordinary husband, father, grandfather, and friend, who is survived by his loving wife of fifty-eight years, Berry Graham Bateman; his daughter, Graham Bateman Ohmstede (Axel); and son, Thomas McCauley Bateman II (Sandra); his grandchildren, Katherine Elizabeth Bateman, Mary Margaret Bateman, and Lindsey Victoria Ohmstede; his brother, John H.
