SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 95

LONG TERM CARE. Requests the Department of Insurance to create a task force to study best practices for coverage of long-term supports and services.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Department of Insurance to create a task force to study best
3	practices for the coverage of long-term supports and services and to increase public
4	knowledge and awareness of the prevalence of need for long-term supports and
5	services among older adults, the costs of services, and the implications for
6	individuals and their families.
7	WHEREAS, long-term supports and services consist of a broad range of day-to-day
8	help needed by people with long-term conditions, disabilities, or frailty; and
9	WHEREAS, in 2018, fourteen million adults in the United States needed long-term
10	supports and services; and
11	WHEREAS, while people with long-term supports and services needs are of all ages,
12	the likelihood of needing long-term services and supports grows as people age; and
13	WHEREAS, without family-provided help, many individuals with long-term
14	supports and services needs would lack the critical support they need to live in the
15	community; and
16	WHEREAS, aside from any availability issues, the cost of paid services often is an
17	impediment to fully meeting needs, with some people foregoing necessary care because of
18	the expense; and

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1	WHEREAS, in spite of the large number of pe	ople who will need long-term supports
2	and services and the potential threat to retirement secu	urity that the high costs represent, most
3	Americans are unaware of how much this care costs o	r who routinely pays for such services.
4	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the S	Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
5	does hereby urge and request the Department of Insur	ance to create a task force to study best
6	practices for the coverage of long-term supports	and services and to increase public
7	knowledge and awareness of the prevalence of need	d for long-term supports and services
8	among older adults, the costs of services, and the i	mplications for individuals and their
9	families.	
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the	task force shall be composed of
11	representatives from any relevant and interested pa	rties including but not limited to the
12	following members:	
13	(1) The commissioner of insurance or his	designee.
14	(2) The deputy commissioner of the off	ice of health, life and annuity of the
15	Department of Insurance or his design	nee.
16	(3) The deputy commissioner of the o	office of consumer services of the
17	Department of Insurance or his design	nee.
18	(4) The chief executive officer of the Lou	uisiana Association of Health Plans or
19	his designee.	
20	(5) The state director of AARP Louisiana	a or his designee.
21	(6) The director of the governor's office of	of elderly affairs or his designee.
22	(7) The executive director of the Louisia	ana Nursing Home Association or his
23	designee.	
24	(8) The chair of the Louisiana Assisted L	iving Association or his designee.
25	(9) The president of the Louisiana State N	Medical Society or his designee.
26	(10) The president and chief executive	officer of the Council for a Better
27	Louisiana or his designee.	
28	(11) The president of the Advocacy Center	r or his designee.
29	(12) A consumer of long-term care service	s to be appointed by the commissioner
30	of insurance.	

1	(13)	A nurse practitioner with a geriatric specialty appointed by the president of
2		the Louisiana Association of Nurse Practitioners.
3	(14)	A home- and community-based provider appointed by the commissioner of
4		insurance.
5	(15)	The secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health or his designee.
6	(16)	The assistant secretary of the office of aging and adult services of the
7		Louisiana Department of Health or his designee.
8	(17)	The assistant secretary of the office for citizens with developmental
9		disabilities of the Louisiana Department of Health or his designee.
10	(18)	The director of the bureau of health services financing of the Louisiana
11		Department of Health or his designee.
12	(19)	The commissioner of administration or his designee.
13	(20)	The chairman of the Senate Committee on Insurance.
14	(21)	The executive director of the Louisiana Managed Medicaid Association or
15		his designee.
16	BE IT	FURTHER RESOLVED that, in carrying out the purposes of this Resolution,
17	the task force	may engage and solicit input, recommendations, and advice from all interested
18	parties and sta	akeholders.
19	BE IT	FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is assigned to the Department of
20	Insurance, wit	h staff support to be provided from existing personnel within the department.
21	BE IT	FURTHER RESOLVED that the commissioner of insurance shall issue the
22	first invitatior	for the initial meeting of the task force no later than September 1, 2021.
23	BE IT	FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of this task force shall serve
24	without comp	ensation, except per diem or expense reimbursement to which they may be
25	individually e	ntitled as members of their constituent organizations.
26	BE IT	FURTHER RESOLVED that the chairman of the Senate Committee on
27	Insurance sha	ll serve as chairman of the task force.
28	BE IT	FURTHER RESOLVED that all departments, boards, agencies, officers, and
29	institutions of	the state and all subdivisions thereof shall cooperate with the task force in
30	providing info	ormation to assist the task force in carrying out its mission.

1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in conducting the study required by this
2	Resolution, the task force shall survey laws relative to commercial and public coverage of
3	long-term supports and services in other states, including but not limited to Tennessee, in
4	order to identify best practices.
5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall make a written report of its
6	findings to the Senate Committee on Insurance and the Senate Committee on Health and
7	Welfare no later than February 1, 2022.
