 - Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
- Section 1. R.S. 28:2(28), 51.1(A)(3), and 53(B)(1) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

§2. Definitions

Whenever used in this Title, the masculine shall include the feminine, the singular shall include the plural, and the following definitions shall apply:

"Psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner" means an advanced practice registered nurse licensed to practice as a nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 37:911 et seq., who focuses clinical practice on individuals, families, or populations across the life span at risk for developing or having a diagnosis of psychiatric disorders, mental health problems, or both. A psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner means a specialist who provides primary mental health care to patients seeking mental health services in a wide range of settings. Primary mental health care provided by a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner involves the continuous and comprehensive services necessary for the promotion of optimal mental health, prevention and treatment of psychiatric disorders, and health maintenance. Such primary Primary health care includes the assessment, diagnosis, and management of mental health problems and psychiatric disorders. A psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner means a provider of direct mental health care services who synthesizes theoretical, scientific, and clinical knowledge for the assessment and management of both health and illness states and who is licensed to practice as a nurse practitioner in Louisiana; in accordance with R.S. 37:911; et seq. For purposes of this Chapter, a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner shall have at least two years training, primary experience, or both, in diagnosis and treatment of mental illness. For purposes of this Chapter, a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner shall also have authority from the Louisiana State Board of Nursing to prescribe legend and certain controlled drugs, in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 37:913(3)(b), (8), and (9) in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the board.

submitting a written request to the board, be granted inactive status. No payment of an annual licensing fee shall be required by any individual who has been granted inactive status. The individual may be granted active status by submitting an application form, paying the appropriate fee established by the board, and meeting all other requirements of the board.

- (3) Any individual who is no longer engaged in the practice of nursing may be granted a license with a retired status upon filing an application requesting retired status and paying the fee established by the board.
- (4) Any individual whose license has lapsed by failing to renew the license may have his license reinstated by submitting an application, paying the appropriate fee established by the board, and meeting any other requirements of the board.
- D. The board may issue temporary permits pursuant to rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the board in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
- E. Upon findings of sufficient evidence that the public health and safety are at risk, the board may require licensees and applicants for licensure to submit to a physical or mental examination by a health care provider designated by the board who is licensed to perform such examination. The licensee or applicant may request a second health care provider to perform an independent medical examination. Refusal of or failure by the licensees or applicant to submit to such examination and to sign for release the findings of such examination to the board shall constitute evidence of any allegations related to such conditions.

- A.(1) An advanced practice registered nurse who has not completed a minimum of four thousand hours of patient contact experience as an advanced practice registered nurse shall receive from the board a license with a transitional status endorsement to practice pursuant to a mentorship agreement.
- (2) An advanced practice registered nurse who applies for an initial or renewal transitional status license shall submit all of the following to the board:
- (a) Proof that the advanced practice registered nurse has entered into a mentorship agreement with a health care provider as specified by the rules and regulations of the board.
- (b) An attestation that the advanced practice registered nurse will practice in accordance with the standards of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the appropriate national professional nursing organization from which he has received certification.
- (c) An attestation that the advanced practice registered nurse has collaborative practice protocols for consultation, collaboration, and referral when appropriate pursuant to a mentorship agreement.
- (d) Proof that the advanced practice registered nurse maintains or is otherwise covered by medical malpractice liability coverage in an amount to be determined by the board, but not less than five hundred thousand dollars per claim with an aggregate liability for all claims during the year of one million five hundred thousand dollars, or proof of participation in the Patient's Compensation Fund.
 - (e) Any other requirements as promulgated by the board.
- (3) An advanced practice registered nurse who receives from the board a transitional status endorsement shall be granted provisional prescriptive authority as determined by the rules and regulations of the board.
- B. An advanced practice registered nurse who has completed a minimum of four thousand hours of patient contact experience as an advanced practice registered nurse shall apply for an initial or renewal license by submitting all of the following to the board:

R.S. 37:920 or 936 to engage in the practice of nursing.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2022."
