1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To express the sincere condolences of the Legislature of Louisiana upon the death of
3	Ernest C. Stephens, AFL- CIO Political Director.
4	WHEREAS, it is with deep regret and profound sorrow that the members of the
5	Legislature of Louisiana have learned of the passing of Ernest Stephens; and
6	WHEREAS, Ernest Stephens was born and raised in Baton Rouge, Louisiana,
7	educated in the East Baton Rouge School System, graduated from Capitol High School, and
8	attended Southern University; and
9	WHEREAS, he became a board member of Construction and General Laborers
10	Local 1177 in January 1976, worked on a number of construction and maintenance jobs, and
11	held positions from general laborer to shift supervisor and job steward; and
12	WHEREAS, Ernest Stephens was appointed to the Executive Board of Laborers
13	Local 1177 in 1992 after serving as an auditor for four years; and
14	WHEREAS, in 1996, he was appointed Union President and served until 2000 when
15	he became Business Manager of Construction & General Laborers Local 1177 until 2008;
16	and
17	WHEREAS, in 2009, Ernest Stephens began working for the Louisiana AFL-CIO
18	where he served as Assistant to the President and Statewide Political Director; and

1	WHEREAS, he worked to coordinate relief efforts between the Unions & American
2	Red Cross during numerous Louisiana disasters; and
3	WHEREAS, Ernest Stephens was married to Irma Stephens for twenty-five years and
4	they had four children and seven grandchildren and he attended the Greater New Guide
5	Baptist Church; and
6	WHEREAS, he served as a board member of the Baton Rouge Workforce Investment
7	Board, Capital Area United Way, and Louisiana A. Philip Randolph Institute and also served
8	as treasurer of the Baton Rouge Building & Construction Trades Council, as well as being
9	a former chairman of the East Baton Rouge Council on Aging and former President of the
10	Greater Baton Rouge AFL-CIO; and
11	WHEREAS, he dedicated his life to improving the lives of hard-working men and
12	women across Louisiana; and
13	WHEREAS, Ernest Stephens was a man of great integrity, well-liked, known for
14	being generous with his kindness and wisdom, and a fierce advocate for social and economic
15	justice; and
16	WHEREAS, he was a forever friend to those needing a mentor, greeting everyone
17	he met with love and respect; and
18	WHEREAS, the success of the state of Louisiana, the strength of our communities,
19	and the overall vitality of American society depend in great measure upon people like Ernest
20	Stephens, who devote and dedicate their life and time to serving others and he will be long
21	remembered by all of those whose lives have been made better because of his care and
22	commitment.
23	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
24	express sincere condolences upon the death of Ernest C. Stephens and extends enduring
25	appreciation for his outstanding service and many accomplishments for the good of the
26	people of the state of Louisiana.
