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Modifies definitions relative to hazardous materials reporting under the Right-to-Know Law

In <u>present law</u>, the Right-To-Know Law provides for the reporting of unauthorized releases from natural gas pipelines and establishes a reportable quantity of 1,000 pounds. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that natural gas pipelines: (1) are to be considered "facilities" under the Right-To-Know law and subject to the reporting requirements under the Right-to-Know Law; and (2) are not to be treated as "transport vehicles" or subject to reporting requirements under the laws regarding hazardous materials transportation and motor carrier safety. <u>Proposed law</u> changes the definition of "owner or operator" with the existing definition of "facility" as well as makes "facility" inclusive of pipelines, by referring to hazardous materials "in" a facility rather than "at" a facility.
