WHEREAS, she was also dedicated to volunteering at the Adoration Chapel at St. John for many years; and

WHEREAS, D was a frequent traveler, visiting Europe with family and friends; an avid reader; and known for her acerbic wit – all attributes she passed on to her children and grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, she was preceded in death by her parents, B. Edward Boudreaux and Martha Chapron Boudreaux, and her brother, Joseph Chapron Boudreaux; and

WHEREAS, those she leaves to cherish her memory include her devoted husband of forty-nine years, Randy Battaglio; son, Paul Battaglio, husband of Leah Battaglio; two daughters, Marti Battaglio, wife of Derek Pourciau, and Erin Biddick, wife of Jeremy Biddick; son, Joey Battaglio; grandchildren, Bella Biddick, Luca Battaglio, Liam Biddick, Madden Pourciau, Sawyer Pourciau, and Lola Battaglio; two brothers, Bernard E.
