Proposed law would have provided that no natural or juridical person would be liable for any civil damages and no cause of action would be maintained against a natural or juridical person who in the course of, through the performance of, or by a provision of their business operations refused to mandate a COVID-19 vaccination for any employee or customer.

Proposed law would have prohibited the state, a state agency, or political subdivision thereof from refusing to permit, renew, or withhold a business license or professional license solely on the basis of the business refusing to mandate COVID-19 vaccinations.

(Proposed to add R.S. 9:2800.28)

VETO MESSAGE:

"This bill is one of three bills passed by the legislature involving COVID-19 vaccines. I am vetoing this bill for many of the same reasons that I vetoed House Bill 498. These bills contribute to the false narrative that the COVID-19 vaccines are anything other than safe and incredibly effective. House Bill 103 is not necessary and does nothing to protect the health and safety of the public."
