CRIME: Creates the crime of unwarranted video surveillance of residential property

| 5 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 6 | Section 1. R.S. 14:283.4 is hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 7 | §283.4. Unwarranted video surveillance of residential property |
| 8 | A. Unwarranted video surveillance of residential property is the use of any |
| 9 | camera or other image recording device for the purpose of observing, viewing, |
| 10 | photographing, filming, or videotaping a neighbor's backyard where that owner of |
| 11 | the neighboring residential property has not consented to the specific instance of |
| 12 | observing, viewing, photographing, filming, or videotaping and there is a reasonable |
| 13 | expectation of privacy. |
| 14 | B.(1) Whoever commits the crime of unwarranted video surveillance of |
| 15 | residential property, upon a first conviction, shall be fined not more than five |
| 16 | hundred dollars, imprisoned for not more than six months, or both. |
| 17 | (2) Upon a second or subsequent conviction, the offender shall be fined not |
| 18 | more than one thousand dollars, imprisoned with or without hard labor for not more |
| 19 | than one year, or both. |

1 (3) Whoever commits the crime of unwarranted video surveillance of
2 residential property against any child under the age of seventeen shall be fined not
3 more than ten thousand dollars and be imprisoned at hard labor for not less than two
4 years nor more than ten years without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of
5 sentence.

Abstract: Creates the crime of unwarranted video surveillance of residential property and provides penalties for commission of the offense.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines unwarranted video surveillance of residential property as the use of any camera or other image recording device for the purpose of observing, viewing, photographing, filming, or videotaping a neighbor's residential property without the consent of the owner.

Proposed law provides the following penalties:

- (1) Upon a first conviction, the offender shall be fined not more than \$500, imprisoned for not more than six months, or both.
- Upon a second or subsequent conviction, the offender shall be fined not more than \$1,000, imprisoned with or without hard labor for not more than one year, or both.
- (3) When the crime is committed against any child under the age of 17, the offender shall be fined not more than \$10,000 and be imprisoned at hard labor for not less than two years or more than ten years without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence.
