2 To enact R.S. 17:265.1, relative to required instruction in public schools; to require public 3 secondary school governing authorities to provide instruction on certain figures from 4 American history; and to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 17:265.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows: 7 §265.1. Historical figures; required instruction 8 A. The governing authority of each public secondary school that offers 9 courses or instruction in American history or Louisiana history shall integrate into such coursework instruction regarding the teachings, writing, academic 10 11 contributions, and historical legacies of the individuals and organization outlined in 12 Subsection B of this Section. 13 B. Such instruction shall include but need not be limited to providing 14 students with information on the following: 15 (1) Jabez Lamar Monroe Curry. 16 (2) William Archibald Dunning. 17 (3) Jubal Anderson Early. 18 (4) Susan Pendleton Lee. 19 (5) Edward Alfred Pollard. 20 (6) Mildred Lewis Rutherford.

Abstract: Requires instruction on several individuals in American history and Louisiana history courses in public secondary schools.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the governing authority of each public school offering American history or Louisiana history instruction to integrate into such coursework instruction on the contributions and legacies of specified historical figures.
