Provides for the prohibition of marketing to minors for medical products, procedures, and pharmaceuticals from state agencies

Proposed law prohibits schools, libraries, and state agencies from directly marketing, soliciting, encouraging, or coercing minors to use any form of medications, medical treatments, or pharmaceuticals, unless express consent has been received from the parent or guardian.

Proposed law also provides that schools, libraries, and state agencies shall not utilize any monetary incentives to entice a minor to receive any form of medical treatment, excluding clinical trials and research.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

The proposed law may result in decreased expenditures at LDH for COVID testing incentive payments (\$12 M Federal).

In FY 23, LDH is projected to spend approximately \$12 M in federal funds for COVID testing incentive payments for students and teachers in K-12 schools. LDH indicates that the K-12 COVID testing incentive program is for the parents of K-12 students, not the students. However, tests are performed at the schools and students are made aware of the program through the schools. The LFO cannot determine if incentive payments to the parents of K-12 students meet the standard of directly marketing, soliciting, encouraging, or coercing minors as described in the bill. To the extent that it does, then LDH expenditures will decrease by \$12 M in FY 23. Note: LFO assumes that COVID testing does not rise to the standard of medical treatment.

Note: The LFO is not able to determine how this bill may impact the ability of state agencies to provide medicine or medical treatment to minors in their custody.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
