LAW ENFORCE/OFFICERS: Provides relative to the training requirements for part-time and reserve peace officers

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 40:2405(A)(2)(b), relative to peace officer training; to provide
3 relative to required training for part-time and reserve peace officers; to provide for
4 implementation of required training for part-time and reserve peace officers; to
5 provide for prospective and retroactive application; and to provide for related
6 matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1. R.S. 40:2405(A)(2)(b) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as
9 follows:

10 §2405. Peace officer training requirements; reimbursement by peace officer

15 (b) Any person who begins employment as a part-time or reserve peace

Abstract: Delays the implementation of required training of part-time and reserve peace officers from Jan. 1, 2022, to Jan.1, 2024.

Present law provides that any person who begins employment as a peace officer in La. subsequent to Jan. 1, 1986, must successfully complete a certified training program approved by the council and successfully pass a council-approved comprehensive examination within one calendar year from the date of initial employment.

Present law requires any person who begins employment as a part-time or reserve peace officer in La. on or after Jan. 1, 2022, to be subject to the requirements of present law.

Proposed law delays the implementation of required training of part-time and reserve peace officers from Jan. 1, 2022, to Jan.1, 2024.

Specifies that proposed law shall have retroactive and prospective application.
