2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3047.2(A)(1), relative to the M.J. Foster Promise Program;		
3	to lower the minimum age required for initial qualification for a program award; and		
4	to provide for related matters.		
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:		
6	Section 1. R.S. $17:3047.2(A)(1)$ is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:		
7	§3047.2. Initial eligibility		
8	A. To be eligible for the award, an applicant shall meet the following		
9	requirements:		
10	(1) Be at least twenty-one eighteen years old.

12	Section 2. The provisions of R.S. $17:3047.2(A)(1)$ as amended by this Act shall be		
13	implemented beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.

Abstract: Lowers the minimum age for initial qualification for an M.J. Foster Promise Award from 21 to 18 beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the M.J. Foster Promise Program, a financial assistance program for students attending a two-year public postsecondary education institution or proprietary school who are enrolled in certain qualified programs. Provides for specific initial eligibility requirements, including being at least 21 years old. <u>Proposed law</u> lowers this age from 21 to 18 beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Revise <u>present law</u> to lower the minimum age for initial qualification for an M.J. Foster Promise Award <u>from</u> 21 to 18 beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.
- 2. Remove <u>proposed law</u> that would have lowered the minimum ACT score needed for qualification for a TOPS-Tech Award.
