Abstract: Lowers the minimum age for initial qualification for an M.J. Foster Promise Award <u>from</u> 21 to 18 beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the M.J. Foster Promise Program, a financial assistance program for students attending a two-year public postsecondary education institution or proprietary school who are enrolled in certain qualified programs. Provides for specific initial eligibility requirements, including being at least 21 years old. <u>Proposed law</u> lowers this age <u>from 21 to 18 beginning</u> with the 2023-2024 academic year.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee</u> on Education to the original bill:

- 1. Revise <u>present law</u> to lower the minimum age for initial qualification for an M.J. Foster Promise Award <u>from</u> 21 <u>to</u> 18 beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.
- 2. Remove <u>proposed law</u> that would have lowered the minimum ACT score needed for qualification for a TOPS-Tech Award.
