BOARDS/COMMISSIONS: Provides relative to occupational licensing.

DIGEST

Present law provides relative to the Occupational Board Compliance Act.

Present law defines terms including the following:

- (1) "Occupational license" means a nontransferable authorization granted by an occupational licensing board for an individual or entity meeting certain qualifications or personal qualifications. In an occupation for which a license is required, it is unlawful for an individual that does not possess a valid occupational license to perform the occupation for compensation.
- (2) "Occupational regulation" means a rule, regulation, restraint, practice, or policy allowing an individual to use an occupational title or work in a lawful occupation, including but not limited to registrations and occupational licenses. The term excludes any license, permit, or regulation established by a parish or municipality.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the authorization granted by an occupational license is for the purpose to fulfill a legitimate fiduciary, public health, safety, or welfare objective.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that occupational regulation allowing an individual to use an occupational title or work in a lawful occupation is for the purpose to fulfill a legitimate fiduciary, public health, safety, or welfare objective or a financial, tax, or accounting objective.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes "qualifications", "registration", and "state policy" from the list of definitions.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the term "fiduciary" includes a trustee under any trust, expressed, implied, resulting or constructive, executor, administrator, guardian, conservator, curator, receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, assignee for the benefit of creditors, partner, agent, officer of a corporation, public or private, public officer, or any other persons acting in a fiduciary capacity for any person, trust or estate.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a board to review a regulation it issued upon request from an interested person.

Proposed law provides procedure and standards for judicial review.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides an exception to the judicial review standards provided in <u>proposed</u> <u>law</u> for challenged regulations promulgated by an occupational licensing board that participates in the Dept. of Justice Occupational Licensing Review Program.

<u>Proposed law</u> does not apply to administrative rules promulgated in accordance with the Human Life Protection Act, which is provided for in <u>present law</u>.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Remove all references to a "specialty occupational certification solely for medical reimbursement".
- 2. Remove provisions relative to state policy for promulgated occupational regulations.
- 3. Create an exception to the standard of judicial review provided in <u>proposed law</u> for regulations promulgated by a board that participates in the occupational review program administered by the Dept. of Justice.
- 4. Make technical changes.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

<u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer</u> <u>Protection, and International Affairs to the reengrossed bill</u>

1. Adds that an occupational regulation allowing an individual to use an occupational title or work in a lawful occupation is for the purpose to fulfill a financial, tax, or accounting objective.
