COSMETOLOGY. Requests the Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology to determine whether, by rule, an applicant or licensee can be required to register their business with the office of the secretary of state as a condition of licensure.

2	To urge and request the Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology to evaluate all its rules and
3	applicable laws and determine whether, by rule, an applicant or licensee can be
4	required to register their business with the office of the secretary of state as a
5	condition of licensure.
6	WHEREAS, the Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology (board) was created in 1950
7	and is comprised of eight members; and
8	WHEREAS, the Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology is responsible for the control
9	and regulation of the practice of cosmetology; the protection of the health, safety, and
10	welfare of the public; and the issuance of certificates of registration for both the practice of
11	cosmetology and the operation of beauty salons; and
12	WHEREAS, in Louisiana, some applicants for licensure of other licensing entities
13	are required by law to register their business with the office of the secretary of state as a
14	condition of licensure; and
15	WHEREAS, the board should consider a policy to require an applicant or licensee
16	to register their business with the office of the secretary of state as a condition of licensure,
17	which would promote transparency and protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public.
18	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana

does hereby urge and request the Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology to evaluate all applicable laws and determine whether, by rule, an applicant or licensee can be required to register their business with the office of the secretary of state as a condition of licensure.
