MEDICAL MARIJUANA: Continues and provides with respect to the special legislative commission on medical marijuana created by HR No. 113 of the 2021 RS

A RESOLUTION

2	To continue and provide with respect to the special legislative commission on medical
3	marijuana created by House Resolution No. 113 of the 2021 Regular Session of the
4	Legislature.
5	WHEREAS, through House Resolution No. 113 of the 2021 Regular Session, the
6	House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana created a special legislative
7	commission to study the laws and regulations of this state pertaining to cultivation,
8	extraction, pharmaceutical and therapeutic use, distribution, and researching of marijuana
9	and to evaluate and identify best practices and regulatory improvements to effectuate the
10	legislatively authorized expansion of Louisiana's medical marijuana program; and
11	WHEREAS, the special commission held public meetings on August 27, October 1,
12	October 29, and November 18, 2021, at which all major aspects of Louisiana's medical
13	marijuana program were vetted; and
14	WHEREAS, through its work, the special commission has proven itself a valuable
15	resource to the legislature and the public as policy issues relating to medical marijuana draw
16	increasing levels of interest from a diverse array of stakeholders; and
17	WHEREAS, in this 2022 Regular Session, the legislature has considered numerous
18	proposals for reforming our state's regulatory systems for medical marijuana production and
19	dispensing; and
20	WHEREAS, as of the date of filing of this Resolution, House Bill No. 697 of this
21	2022 Regular Session, a bill proposing significant reforms to Louisiana's essential medical

1 marijuana regulatory functions, has achieved final passage in both the House and Senate 2 with over a two-thirds majority of the elected members of the legislature voting yea on the 3 measure; and 4 WHEREAS, it is vitally important that patient access to medical marijuana does not 5 diminish during the implementation of any regulatory reforms that may be enacted in law. 6 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 7 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby continue the special legislative commission on medical 8 marijuana created by House Resolution No. 113 of the 2021 Regular Session. 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duties of the special commission shall 10 continue as provided in House Resolution No. 113 of the 2021 Regular Session, and that the 11 special commission shall have the additional duty of oversight and monitoring of the 12 transition of any medical marijuana regulatory function of this state for the purpose of 13 ensuring that patient access to medical marijuana in Louisiana continues uninterrupted or 14 improves through the transition. 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Louisiana Department of Health, Louisiana 16 Department of Agriculture and Forestry, Louisiana Board of Pharmacy, Department of 17 Economic Development, Louisiana Department of Revenue, and legislative auditor may 18 continue to provide to the special commission any support necessary for the commission to 19 perform its duties. 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the special commission shall report its findings 21 and recommendations concerning medical marijuana policy and regulation to the speaker 22 of the House of Representatives no later than February 1, 2023. 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the 24 secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health, the commissioner of agriculture, the 25 executive director of the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy, the secretary of the Department of 26 Economic Development, the secretary of the Louisiana Department of Revenue, and the 27 legislative auditor.
