HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 254

BY REPRESENTATIVE IVEY

LEGISLATIVE POWERS: Requests House standing committees to study the provisions of the state constitution and to make recommendations for revisions

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request each standing committee of the House of Representatives to study the
3	provisions of the Constitution of Louisiana within the jurisdiction of the committee
4	and to make recommendations regarding revisions to those provisions to the House
5	of Representatives no later than March 15, 2023.
6	WHEREAS, it has been more than forty-seven years since the Constitution of
7	Louisiana became effective at midnight on December 31, 1974, and during these years the
8	document which constitutes the state's fundamental law has been amended some two
9	hundred three times; and
10	WHEREAS, the need to address a number of key policy areas that require
11	constitutional change has become apparent, including such matters as the state's tax structure
12	and budgetary practices that hamper the state's economic growth and competitiveness as well
13	as the quality of life of Louisiana residents; the prioritization of expenditures through the
14	dedication of state revenues and the resulting inability of the legislature to allocate resources
15	to other priorities, particularly for the needs of health care and higher education; the fiscal
16	restraints on local governments that dramatically limit their authority to meet fiscal and
17	budgetary demands; and other matters; and
18	WHEREAS, the constitution contains many provisions that prohibit or restrict the
19	legislature in effectively addressing state and constituent needs, and also includes extensive
20	provisions that are so detailed as to be statutory rather than constitutional in nature and, as
21	a result, require further constitutional amendment when any change is needed; and

1	WHEREAS, a serious analysis of the state constitution is necessary to address the
2	state's critical needs; to undertake an in-depth consideration of reform proposals; and to craft
3	provisions that allow for flexibility and innovation in legislative solutions to problems of the
4	present and the future, and the standing committees of the legislature are uniquely positioned
5	to recognize issues and recommend appropriate and necessary revisions.
6	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
7	Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request each standing committee of the House
8	of Representatives to study the provisions of the Constitution of Louisiana within the
9	jurisdiction of the committee, to report its activities regarding those provisions, and to
10	include in such report its analysis of those provisions to the House of Representatives, no
11	later than March 15, 2023.
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that House of Representatives does hereby request
13	each standing committee to specifically include in its report all of the following information:
14	(1) Identification of the provisions of the constitution within its purview that
15	constitute fundamental law.
16	(2) Identification of language in the provisions of the constitution within its purview
17	that is not considered fundamental law and that either from a best practice or comparative
18	perspective is unusual for a constitution or is most commonly statutory in nature.
19	(3) Identification of language in the provisions of the constitution within its purview
20	that is legally unnecessary, redundant, or obsolete.
21	(4) Identification of language in the provisions of the constitution within its purview
22	that is transitional in nature and which should either be removed or updated.
23	(5) Identification of language in the provisions of the constitution within its purview
24	that, from an organizational or structural perspective, should either be placed elsewhere in
25	the constitution or reworded.
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House of Representatives does hereby
27	request the clerk of the House of Representatives to review and assign each provision of the
28	Constitution of Louisiana to the appropriate standing committee of the House of
29	Representatives no later than fifteen days after the adoption of this Resolution.
