Existing law provides rules regarding licensure, qualifications, and exemptions for persons engaged in the practice of massage therapy.

<u>Existing law</u> requires applicants for a massage therapist license to pay the application fee and submit evidence satisfactory to the La. Board of Massage Therapy that the applicant has satisfactorily completed a minimum 500-hour in-class supervised course of studies pursuant to rules promulgated by the board in accordance with the APA.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>existing law</u> but requires that the minimum 500 hours of massage therapy techniques and clinical practicum be earned through in-person, in-class, instructor-supervised learning. <u>New law</u> further provides that hours above the required minimum 500 hours may be a combination of in-person, in-class, instructor-supervised learning and real-time synchronous distance learning.

<u>New law</u> defines "in-person, in-class, instructor-supervised" learning and "real-time synchronous distance learning".

Effective August 1, 2022.
