<u>Existing law</u> requires existing one- or two-family dwellings to have a smoke detector with a 10-year, sealed lithium battery at the time the dwelling is sold or leased.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>existing law</u> and adds that existing one- or two-family dwellings are further required to have a carbon monoxide detector with a long-life, sealed battery at the time the dwelling is sold or leased.

<u>New law</u> requires a professional installer who installs a home generator in one- or two-family dwellings to include a carbon monoxide detector with a long-life, sealed battery with installation. Further authorizes combination of the carbon monoxide detector with a smoke detector.

New law (uncodified) provides that the provisions of <u>new law</u> requiring carbon monoxide detectors do not supersede or prevent the La. State Uniform Construction Code Council from performing its duties pursuant to <u>existing law</u> (R.S. 40:1730.22(C)). Further provides that <u>new law</u> applies only to those certain dwellings that are sold, leased, or which have home generators installed on or after Jan. 1, 2023.

Effective August 1, 2022.
