## DIGEST 2023 Regular Session

**Fields** 

<u>Proposed law</u> requires on or before July 1, 2024, the owner or operator of each facility must operate an air monitoring system at a location determined by the department. <u>Proposed law</u> provides for the criteria of pollutants the system must monitor.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a monitoring system to be installed by the facility and any monitoring costs incurred by the department be borne by the facility.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "facility" as any stationary source or any group of stationary sources that are located on one or more contiguous or adjacent properties, which are under common control of the same person or persons and are defined as a major source under the federal Clean Air Act, <u>present law</u>, or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to either law.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines an "air monitoring system" as equipment required to be installed by <u>present law</u> that measures and records air pollutant concentrations and is used for detecting an exceedance of air quality standards or the existence of a public health threat. Requires that the system include real-time data collection and real-time data public alerts.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires facility owners or operators required to operate an air monitoring system to maintain the records of all data from such system for five years and report the data to the department twice each year beginning January 1, 2025.

<u>Proposed law</u> further requires compliance with the Environmental Protection Agency's monitoring requirements.

Effective August 1, 2023.
