AN ACT

COURTS: Provides relative to marshals and constables

| 2  | To amend and reenact R.S. 13:1879, 1881(B), and 1883(A)(introductory paragraph) and (C) |
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| 3  | relative to certain marshals and constables of city courts; to provide relative to      |
| 4  | elections and designations of marshals and constables; to provide for the               |
| 5  | compensation of certain marshals and constables; to provide for the designation of      |
| 6  | the marshal of the city of Sulphur; and to provide for related matters.                 |
| 7  | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:  |
| 8  | Section 1. R.S. 13:1879, 1881(B), and 1883(A)(introductory paragraph) and (C) are       |
| 9  | hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:  |
| 10 | §1879. Marshals and constables; election; term of office; exceptions for Lake           |
| 11 | Charles and Baton Rouge   |
| 12 | A.(1) For Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, for each city             |
| 13 | court, except in the city of Lake Charles, there shall be a marshal or constable, as he |
| 14 | may be designated. Except as provided in Subsection C Paragraph (B)(1) of this          |
| 15 | Section, each marshal or constable shall be elected at the congressional election,      |
| 16 | beginning in the year 1960 and every succeeding six years thereafter, shall serve a     |
| 17 | term of six years, and shall take office and begin his term on the first day of January |
| 18 | following election. In the city of Lake Charles, the marshal shall be designated as     |
| 19 | the ward three marshal.   |

| 9  | (2) In the city of Lake Charles, the marshal shall be designated as the ward           |

| 13 | D.C. Except as otherwise provided by law, the provisions of this Part relating         |
| 14 | to marshals of city courts and their deputies shall apply to constables of city courts |
| 15 | and their deputies.  |

| 17 | §1881. General powers and duties of marshal; deputy marshals                           |
| 18 | * * *  |
| 19 | B. The marshal may appoint one or more deputy marshals having the same                 |
| 20 | powers and authority as the marshal, but the marshal shall be responsible for their    |
| 21 | actions. The compensation of the deputy marshals shall be fixed and paid by the        |
| 22 | governing authorities of the city or parish, or both, where the court is located has   |
| 23 | territorial jurisdiction. The city marshal may use funds available for expenses of his |
| 24 | office, including proceeds from costs assessed in criminal matters pursuant to R.S.    |
| 25 | 13:1899, to pay an amount in excess of the fixed salary or to pay the amount fixed     |
| 26 | or any portion thereof to deputy marshals or to employ additional deputies.            |
| 27 | However, nothing herein shall authorize the city marshal to fix or supplement his      |
| 28 | own salary. In no event shall the salary of any deputy exceed that of his city         |
| 29 | marshal.   |
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§1883. Compensation of marshal

A. The marshals of the city courts enumerated in this Subsection shall receive as compensation for their services the following minimum salaries, payable monthly on their own warrant and which, except as otherwise indicated, shall be paid in equal proportions by the respective governing authorities of the city and parish where the court is located has territorial jurisdiction:

C. Except as provided in R.S. 13:2071, in all other cases the marshal's salary shall be paid by the governing body of the city and parish where the court is located has territorial jurisdiction, in such amounts as they may determine, except that where the population of the territorial jurisdiction of the court is more than 10,000 inhabitants, the marshal shall receive a minimum annual salary of \$3,600 payable monthly in equal proportions by the governing authorities of the city and parish on the warrant of the marshal.

**Abstract:** Provides relative to the designation of the marshal of the city court of Sulphur and the source of funding for certain marshals and constables.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a marshal or constable, except the marshal of the City Court of Lake Charles, may be designated for each city court.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds an exception for the marshal of the city of Sulphur and designates the marshal as the ward four marshal.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the payment of deputy marshal salaries exclusively by the local governing authority of the city or parish, or both, where the court is located.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the payment of deputy marshal salaries by the local governing authority of the city or parish, or both, where the court has territorial jurisdiction.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the marshals of city courts shall be paid by the governing authorities of the city and parish where the court is located.

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<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the marshals of city courts shall be paid by the governing authorities of the city and parish where the court has territorial jurisdiction.
