Abstract: Provides for additional topics to be covered in the online handgun education course that is provided to La. residents.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the DPS&C, office of state police, shall provide a two-hour online handgun education course at no cost to La. residents.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the length of the online course to be two hours.

<u>Proposed law</u> amends <u>present law</u> to change the length of the online course <u>from</u> two hours <u>to</u> two hours and 15 minutes.

Present law provides that the online handgun education course shall cover all of the following topics:

- (1) Handgun basics and nomenclature.
- (2) Firearm-free zones.
- (3) Use of deadly force.
- (4) Interactions with law enforcement officers.
- (5) Conflict resolution.
- (6) Accident prevention.
- (7) Unauthorized access prevention.
- (8) Safe handling of a handgun.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>, but amends the topic of "handgun basics and nomenclature" to include handling procedures for a revolver and a semiautomatic pistol.

<u>Proposed law</u> further combines the topic of "safe storage of firearms" with the topic of "accident prevention".

<u>Proposed law</u> further adds the topic of "suicide prevention, with an emphasis on the impact of firearm-related suicides involving veterans and current service members of the U.S. Armed Forces" to the course.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the DPS&C, office of state police, shall divide the topics provided in present law into eight video segments that shall broadcast for no less than 15 minutes per segment.

<u>Proposed law</u> amends <u>present law</u> to change the number of video segments <u>from</u> eight <u>to</u> nine, but still provides that the video segments that shall broadcast for no less than 15 minutes per segment.
