DISTRICTS/NEIGHBORHOOD: Creates the University Security District in East Baton Rouge Parish

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 33:9097.37, relative to East Baton Rouge Parish, to create the University
3	Security District; to provide relative to the boundaries, purpose, governance, and
4	powers and duties of the district; to provide relative to district funding, including the
5	authority to impose a parcel fee within the district; to provide for an effective date;
6	and to provide for related matters.
7	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
8	as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of
9	Louisiana.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 33:9097.37 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	<u>§9097.37.</u> University Security District
13	A. There is hereby created within the parish of East Baton Rouge, as more
14	specifically provided in Subsection B of this Section, a body politic and corporate
15	which shall be known as the University Security District, referred to in this Section
16	as the "district". The district shall be a political subdivision of the state as defined
17	in the Constitution of Louisiana.
18	B. The district shall include all property within the following boundaries:
19	beginning at the of the Mississippi River at a point perpendicular to Roosevelt Street,
20	east along Roosevelt Street to Georgia Street, then along the southern boundary of

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1	McKinley High School, and along the southern boundary of Lake Crest to the		
2	intersection of Dalrymple Drive, then south on Dalrymple Drive to the boundary of		
3	Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, then east to		
4	University Lake, then along the western boundary of University Lake to the		
5	intersection with Lake Crest, then to the shortest point of University Lake southwest		
6	to the intersection of West Lakeshore Drive and East Parker Drive, then southeast		
7	on East Parker Drive to the intersection with Highland Road, then southeast on		
8	Highland Road to the intersection of Burrow Road, then southwest along Burrow		
9	Road to the drainage canal located at or near 30.399268 North and 91.169831 West,		
10	then southeasterly along the drainage canal to the intersection with Bayou Fountain,		
11	then southeasterly along Bayou Fountain to point in the bayou closest to 30.385301		
12	North and 91.150288 West; then to the intersection of Elbow Bayou and La.		
13	Highway 30, then along Elbow Bayou to point 30.357425 North and 91.192587		
14	West, then to 30.372204 North and 91.190475 West, the to 30.370592 North and		
15	91.175198 West, then 30.373996 North and 91.174828 West, then 30.375890 North		
16	and 91.192608 West, then north to Brightside Drive, then west along Brightside		
17	Drive to the Mississippi River, then north along the Mississippi River to the point of		
18	the beginning.		
19	C. The purpose of the district shall be to aid in crime prevention and to add		
20	to the security of district residents by providing for an increase in the presence of law		
21	enforcement personnel in the district and to serve the needs of the residents of the		
22	district by funding beautification and improvements for the overall betterment of the		
23	district.		
24	D.(1) The district shall be governed by an eleven-member board of		
25	commissioners, referred to in this Section as the "board". The board shall be		
26	composed as follows:		
27	(a) The president of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and		
28	Mechanical College shall appoint four members.		

1	(b) The board of directors of the Northgate Merchants Association shall	
2	appoint one member.	
3	(c) The board of directors of the Southgate Merchants Association shall	
4	appoint one member.	
5	(d) The member of the Louisiana House of Representatives whose district	
6	encompasses all or the greater number of property owners in the area of the district	
7	shall appoint one member.	
8	(e) The member of the Louisiana Senate whose district encompasses all or	
9	the greater number of property owners in the area of the district shall appoint one	
10	member.	
11	(f) A person appointed by each councilperson of the East Baton Rouge	
12	Metropolitan Council whose district, either wholly or in part, is included in the	
13	boundaries of the district.	
14	(2) Except for those members appointed by the president of Louisiana State	
15	University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, all members of the board shall	
16	own property and reside within the district and shall be qualified voters of the	
17	district.	
18	(3)(a) Members shall serve four-year terms after initial terms as provided in	
19	this Subparagraph. Three members shall serve an initial term of one year; three shall	
20	serve two years; three shall serve three years, and two shall serve four years, as	
21	determined by lot at the first meeting of the board.	
22	(b) Any vacancy which occurs prior to the expiration of the term for which	
23	a member of the board has been appointed shall be filled for the remainder of the	
24	unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment. Board members	
25	shall be eligible for reappointment.	
26	(4) The board shall elect from its members a chairman, a vice chairman, a	
27	secretary, a treasurer, and such other officers as it may deem necessary. The duties	
28	of the officers shall be fixed by the bylaws adopted by the board.	

1	(5) The minute books and archives of the district shall be maintained by the	
2	secretary of the board. The monies, funds, and accounts of the district shall be in the	
3	official custody of the board.	
4	(6) The board shall adopt such bylaws as it deems necessary or advisable for	
5	conducting its business affairs. Rules and regulations of the board relative to the	
6	notice and conduct of meetings shall conform to applicable law, including, if	
7	applicable, the Open Meetings Law. The board shall hold regular meetings as shall	
8	be provided for in the bylaws and may hold special meetings at such times and	
9	places within the district as may be prescribed in the bylaws.	
10	(7) The members of the board shall serve without compensation but shall be	
11	reimbursed for their reasonable out-of-pocket expenses directly related to the	
12	governance of the district.	
13	E. The district, acting through its board, shall have the following powers and	
14	duties:	
15	(1) To sue and be sued.	
16	(2) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.	
17	(3) To receive and expend funds collected pursuant to Subsections F and G	
18	of this Section and in accordance with a budget adopted as provided by Subsection	
19	H of this Section.	
20	(4) To enter into contracts with individuals or entities, private or public.	
21	(5) To provide or enhance security patrols in the district, to provide for	
22	improved lighting, signage, or matters relating to the security of the district, to	
23	provide for the beautification of and improvements for the district, or to provide	
24	generally for the overall betterment of the district.	
25	F. The district, through the board, may impose and collect a parcel fee within	
26	the district subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Subsection.	
27	(1)(a) The fee shall be imposed on each improved and unimproved parcel	
28	located within the district. The owner of the parcel shall be responsible for payment	
29	of the fee.	

1	(b) For purposes of this Section, the fee shall be a flat fee per parcel not to	
2	exceed four hundred dollars per year for unimproved parcels zoned residential, four	
3	hundred dollars per year for unimproved and improved single-family parcels zoned	
4	residential, six hundred dollars per year for multiple adjacent residential parcels	
5	housing a single family dwelling; five thousand dollars per year for multi-family	
6	parcels zoned residential, and five thousand dollars per year for unimproved and	
7	improved parcels zoned commercial.	
8	(2)(a) The initial amount of the fee shall be as provided in a duly adopted	
9	resolution of the governing authority of the district. The initial fee shall not exceed	
10	one hundred fifty dollars per parcel per year.	
11	(b) The fee shall be imposed only after the question of its imposition has	
12	been approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting on the	
13	proposition at an election held for that purpose in accordance with the Louisiana	
14	Election Code.	
15	(3) Not less than three years after approval of the parcel fee by a majority of $\frac{1}{2}$	
16	registered voters of the district as provided in this Subsection, the governing	
17	authority of the district may increase the amount of the parcel fee one time without	
18	an election. The amount of the increased fee shall be as provided in a duly adopted	
19	resolution of the board, not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars per parcel per year.	
20	However, the amount of the increased fee shall not exceed the maximum amount	
21	provided in Subparagraph(1)(b) of this Subsection.	
22	(4) The parcel fee shall expire at the end of the term provided for in the	
23	proposition authorizing the fee, not to exceed fifteen years, but the fee may be	
24	renewed if approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting on	
25	the proposition at an election as provided in Subparagraph (2)(b) of this Subsection.	
26	Any election to authorize the renewal of the fee shall be held for that purpose in	
27	accordance with the Louisiana Election Code. If the fee is renewed, the term of the	
28	imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such	
29	renewal, not to exceed fifteen years.	

1	(5) The fee shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as ad	
2	valorem taxes are collected by the sheriff, as ex officio tax collector, of the parish of	
3	East Baton Rouge. The sheriff shall collect and remit to the district all amounts	
4	collected. The district may enter into an agreement with the sheriff to authorize the	
5	sheriff to retain a collection fee not to exceed one percent of the amount collected.	
6	(6) Any parcel fee which is unpaid shall be added to the tax rolls of East	
7	Baton Rouge Parish and shall be enforced with the same authority and subject to the	
8	same penalties and procedures as unpaid ad valorem taxes.	
9	G. The district is authorized to solicit and accept additional voluntary	
10	contributions and grants to further the purposes of the district.	
11	H.(1) The board of commissioners shall adopt an annual budget in	
12	accordance with the Louisiana Local Government Budget Act, R.S. 39:1301 et seq.	
13	(2) The district shall be subject to audit by the legislative auditor pursuant	
14	<u>to R.S. 24:513.</u>	
15	I.(1) It is the purpose and intent of this Section that the additional law	
16	enforcement personnel and their services provided for through the fees authorized	
17	in this Section shall be supplemental to and not in lieu of personnel and services	
18	provided in the district by the city of Baton Rouge, parish of East Baton Rouge.	
19	(2) If the district ceases to exist, any funds of the district shall be transmitted	
20	to the governing authority of the city Baton Rouge, parish of East Baton Rouge and	
21	shall be used for law enforcement purposes in the area which comprised the district.	
22	J.(1) The district shall indemnify its officers and board members to the	
23	fullest extent permitted by R.S. 12:227, as fully as if the district were a nonprofit	
24	corporation governed thereby, and as may be provided in the district's bylaws.	
25	(2) No board member or officer of the district shall be liable to the district	
26	or to any individual who resides, owns property, visits, or otherwise conducts	
27	business in the district for monetary damages for breach of his duties as a board	
28	member or officer, provided that this provision shall not eliminate or limit the	
29	liability of a board member or officer for any of the following:	

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1	(a) Acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional	
2	misconduct or a knowing violation of law.	
3	(b) Any transaction from which he derived an improper personal benefit.	
4	(3) To the fullest extent permitted by R.S. 9:2792 et seq., including R.S.	
5	9:2792.1 through 2792.9, a person serving the district as a board member or officer	
6	shall not be individually liable for any act or omission arising out of the performance	
7	of his duties.	
8	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not	
9	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature	
10	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If	
11	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become	
12	effective on the day following such approval.

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Abstract: Creates the University Security District in East Baton Rouge Parish. Provides for the district's boundaries, purpose, governance, and funding, including the authority to impose a parcel fee.

Proposed law creates the University Security District in East Baton Rouge Parish as a political subdivision of the state for the purpose of aiding in crime prevention and providing for overall betterment of the district. Provides for district boundaries. Provides that the district shall be governed by a board of commissioners composed as follows:

- Four members appointed by the president of La. State University and Agricultural (1)and Mechanical College.
- (2) One member appointed by the board of directors of the Northgate Merchants Association.
- One member appointed by the board of directors of the Southgate Merchants (3) Association.
- One member appointed by the member of the La. House of Representatives whose (4) district encompasses all or the greater number of property owners in the area of the district.
- One member appointed by the member of the La. Senate whose district encompasses (5) all or the greater number of property owners in the area of the district.

(6) One member appointed by each councilperson of the East Baton Rouge Metropolitan Council whose district, either wholly or in part, is included in the boundaries of the district.

Provides that members serve four-year staggered terms.

Proposed law provides for the district's powers and duties including the following:

- (1) To sue and be sued.
- (2) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.
- (3) To receive and expend funds from an authorized parcel fee and other contributions and in accordance with an adopted budget.
- (4) To enter into contracts with individuals or entities, private or public.
- (5) To provide or enhance security patrols in the district, to provide for improved lighting, signage, or matters relating to the security of the district, to provide for the beautification of and improvement to the district, and to provide generally for the overall betterment of the district.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the district, subject to voter approval, to impose and collect a parcel fee on each improved and unimproved parcel. Further provides that the amount of the fee shall be as follows:

- (1) For unimproved parcels zoned residential the fee shall be a flat fee per parcel of land not to exceed \$400 per year.
- (2) For unimproved and improved single-family parcels zoned residential the fee shall be a flat fee per parcel of land not to exceed \$400 per year.
- (3) For multiple adjacent residential parcels housing a single family dwelling the fee shall be a flat fee not to exceed \$600 per year.
- (4) For improved multi-family parcels zoned residential the fee shall be a flat fee not to exceed \$5000 per year.
- (5) For unimproved and improved parcels zoned commercial the fee shall not exceed \$5000 per year.

Provides that the initial fee shall not exceed \$150 per parcel per year.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the fee shall expire at the end of the term provided for in the proposition authorizing the fee, not to exceed 15 years. Authorizes the board to increase the fee one time without election not less than three years after initial approval. Provides that the increased fee shall not exceed \$250 per parcel per year, but shall not exceed the maximum amount provided in proposed law. Authorizes renewal of the fee, subject to voter approval, for a term not to exceed 15 years.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the fee shall be collected in the same manner and at the same time as ad valorem taxes and that any unpaid fee shall be added to the parish tax rolls and enforced with the same authority and subject to the same penalties and procedures as unpaid ad valorem taxes. Requires the tax collector to remit to the district all amounts collected not more than 60 days after collection and authorizes the district to enter into an agreement with the tax collector to authorize the retention of a collection fee, not to exceed 1% of the amount collected.

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<u>Proposed law</u> requires the district's board to adopt an annual budget in accordance with the La. Local Government Budget Act and provides that the district shall be subject to audit by the legislative auditor.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that it is the purpose and intent of <u>proposed law</u> that the additional law enforcement personnel and their services provided for through the fees authorized by <u>proposed law</u> shall be supplemental to, and not in lieu of, personnel and services provided in the district by the city-parish.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if the district ceases to exist, all district funds shall be transmitted to the governing authority of East Baton Rouge Parish and used for law enforcement purposes in the area that comprised the district.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
