Creates the crime of approaching a law enforcement officer lawfully engaged in law enforcement duties

Proposed law adds the crime of approaching a law enforcement officer and prohibits any person from knowingly approaching (within twenty-five (25) feet) a law enforcement officer (LEO) engaged in the execution of his official duties after the LEO has ordered the person to stop approaching. Proposed law assesses the penalty for the violation of approaching a law enforcement officer as imprisonment for no more than 60 days, or a fine of not more than \$500 dollars, or both.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures in the Department of Public Safety and Corrections – Corrections Services (DPSC – CS) if a person is convicted of approaching a law enforcement officer. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation is indeterminable, since it creates a new crime, and it is not known how many people will be convicted nor the length of the sentences assessed with those convictions as a result of its potential enactment.

SGF expenditures will increase by \$101.76 per offender per day to the extent that an offender is convicted and then subsequently housed in a state facility or \$26.39 per offender per day for an offender housed in a local facility. Since proposed law is a misdemeanor offense, the maximum fiscal impact per offender per offense is \$1,583 for an offender housed in a local facility (\$26.39 per offender per day x 60 days) and \$6,106 for an offender housed in a state facility (\$101.76 per offender per day x 60 days).

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in local revenues as a result of potential fines for approaching a law enforcement officer. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation on local revenue is indeterminable because the fines that would be imposed on those convicted are optional, and the amount of the fines, if imposed, may vary.
