Amendments proposed by House Committee on Commerce to Original House Bill No. 112

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 2, after "To" insert "amend and reenact R.S. 44:4.1(B)(23) and to"

3 AMENDMENT NO. 2

4 On page 1, line 6, after "costs;" insert "to provide for a public records exception;"

5 AMENDMENT NO. 3

6 On page 4, delete line 3 and insert in lieu thereof the following:

7 "F.(1) Criminal history record information shall be considered confidential
8 information and the board, its members, officers, investigators, agents, and attorneys
9 shall use the criminal history record information exclusively to evaluate the
10 applicant's eligibility or disqualification.

11 (2) Criminal history record information obtained in accordance with this
12 Section shall not be released or otherwise disclosed by the board to any person or
13 agency without the written consent of the applicant unless the release is ordered by
14 a court of competent jurisdiction.

15 Section 2. R.S. 44:4.1(B)(23) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

16 §4.1. Exceptions

17 * * *

18 B. The legislature further recognizes that there exist exceptions, exemptions,
19 and limitations to the laws pertaining to public records throughout the revised
20 statutes and codes of this state. Therefore, the following exceptions, exemptions, and
21 limitations are hereby continued in effect by incorporation into this Chapter by
22 citation:
