Provides for tracking rape kits from collection through conviction. (8/1/23)

<u>Proposed law</u> requires LA State Police to create and operate a statewide sexual assault collection kit tracking system. <u>Proposed law</u> allows State Police to use a phased implementation process according to region or volume of kits but requires full implementation and participation no later than 7/01/24. <u>Proposed law</u> requires State Police to submit a report to the LA Sexual Assault Oversight Commission, Senate Judiciary B Committee, and the governor before 1/01/24 and submit annual reports no later than 7/31 each year. <u>Proposed law</u> requires healthcare providers to provide all information required by the statewide tracking system but not held civilly liable for damages arising from any release of information or the failure to relate information. <u>Proposed law</u> requires the healthcare provider/facility that performs the forensic medical exam to submit a reimbursement claim to the LA Crime Victim Reparations Board and reimbursement shall not constitute reparations so it shall be immediately payable and not require approval from the board. <u>Proposed law</u> prohibits billing the victim.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law will increase SGF expenditures by \$737,541 for creating and operating a statewide sexual assault kit tracking system within the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Public Safety Service (DPS), Office of State Police beginning in FY 24 and subsequent fiscal years reflecting an anticipated increase in personal services and software. The proposed law requires the State Police to create, operate, and maintain a statewide sexual assault kit tracking system and requires healthcare providers to provide all information required by the tracking system.

Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement (LCLE)

Proposed law may result in minimal cost savings for the LA Commission on Law Enforcement (LCLE). The LCLE reports the proposed law would simplify the process of reimbursing healthcare providers for forensic medical examination. This may save time and expedite payments request as a result of not having the approval of the Crime Victims Reparations Board.


Department of Public Safety, Office of State Police

DPS reports needing three (3) additional positions within the State Police Crime Lab to manage a statewide sexual assault kit tracking program. The staffing estimate includes \$292,971 (\$179,734 salaries and \$113,237 related benefits). Other costs include one-time training (\$75,000 in FY 24), automotive maintenance (\$900), office supplies (\$900), supplies to purchase test kits (\$107,000 in FY 24 and \$50,000 in subsequent fiscal years), IAT to Office of Technology Services (OTS) to purchase software (\$250,000 in FY 24), annual maintenance (\$190,000 in subsequent fiscal years), telephone (\$1,008), computer equipment (\$1,962) and acquisitions of office furniture (\$4,800) and data equipment (\$3,000). In subsequent fiscal years, the fiscal note presumes a 3% increase in salaries for market rate adjustments and related benefits as the LFO presumes the new positions will be classified.
