HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

2023 Regular Session

Substitute for Original House Bill No. 106 by Representative Dustin Miller as proposed by the House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice

This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

To enact R.S. 40:989.4, relative to the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law; to create the crime of unlawful production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of Xylazine; provide relative to criminal penalties; to provide relative to exceptions; to provide for a definition; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

- Section 1. R.S. 40:989.4 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
- §989.4. Unlawful production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of Xylazine
- A.(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly or intentionally produce, manufacture, distribute, or possess with intent to produce, manufacture, or distribute Xylazine.
- (2) Whoever violates the provisions of this Subsection shall be imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for not less than one year nor more than ten years and, in addition, may be required to pay a fine of not more than fifteen thousand dollars.
- B.(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly or intentionally possess Xylazine.
- (2) Whoever violates the provisions of this Subsection shall be imprisoned for not more than six months and, in addition, may be required to pay a fine of not more than five hundred dollars.
 - C. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to the following:
- (a) The production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of Xylazine in the course of a legitimate veterinary practice.
- (b) The possession of Xylazine pursuant to a valid prescription from a licensed veterinarian.

D. As used in this Section, "Xylazine" means Xylazine and any salt, sulfate, isomer, homologue, analogue, or other preparation of Xylazine, and any salt, isomer, compound, derivative, precursor, homologue, analogue, or other preparation thereof that is substantially chemically equivalent or identical to Xylazine.

Abstract: Creates the crime of unlawful production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of Xylazine.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that it is unlawful for any person to knowingly or intentionally produce, manufacture, distribute, or possess with intent to produce, manufacture, or distribute Xylazine.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that whoever violates <u>proposed law</u> shall be imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for not less than one year nor more than 10 years and, in addition, may be required to pay a fine of not more than \$15,000.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that it is unlawful for any person to knowingly or intentionally possess Xylazine.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that whoever violates <u>proposed law</u> shall be imprisoned for not more than six months and, in addition, may be required to pay a fine of not more than \$500.

Provides that the <u>proposed law</u> crime of unlawful production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of Xylazine shall not apply to the following:

- (1) The production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of Xylazine in the course of a legitimate veterinary practice.
- (2) The possession of Xylazine pursuant to a valid prescription from a licensed veterinarian.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "Xylazine" as Xylazine and any salt, sulfate, isomer, homologue, analogue, or other preparation of Xylazine, and any salt, isomer, compound, derivative, precursor, homologue, analogue, or other preparation thereof that is substantially chemically equivalent or identical to Xylazine.
