| 10 | A. No person shall knowingly or intentionally approach within twenty-five |
| 11 | feet of a law enforcement officer who is lawfully engaged in the execution of his |
| 12 | official duties after the law enforcement officer has ordered the person to stop |
| 13 | approaching or to retreat. |
| 14 | B. For the purposes of this Section, "law enforcement officer" means any |
| 15 | commissioned police officer, sheriff, deputy sheriff, marshal, deputy marshal, |
| 16 | correctional officer, probation and parole officer, constable, wildlife enforcement |
| 17 | agent, or state park warden. |
| 18 | C. Whoever violates the provisions of this Section shall be fined not more |
| 19 | than five hundred dollars, imprisoned for not more than sixty days, or both. |

Abstract: Creates the crime of approaching a law enforcement officer who is lawfully engaged in his law enforcement duties and provides for penalties.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no person shall knowingly or intentionally approach within 25 feet of a law enforcement officer who is lawfully engaged in the execution of his official duties after the law enforcement officer has ordered a person to stop approaching or to retreat.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "law enforcement officer" as any commissioned police officer, sheriff, deputy sheriff, marshal, deputy marshal, correctional officer, probation and parole officer, constable, wildlife enforcement agent, or state park warden.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for a fine of not more than \$500, imprisonment for not more than 60 days, or both.
